

Today's Normal AXP Experience

- Many firms do not provide organized training
- Aspiring Architects gain practical experience in a haphazard manner
- Aspiring Architects' expectations are vague and incomplete
- Formal education usually stops after graduation
- Career guidance is non-existent
- Aspiring Architects feel that they are not really part of the firm

- General dissatisfaction among Aspiring Architects

- Keeping up with a fast-changing profession







AXP is a developmental

program

It is designed so that Aspiring Architects will acquire knowledge, skills, and career awareness in an organized manner

AXP assists in developing

competencies

Knowledge and skills which are retained and refined through continued practice as a licensed architect

AXP HAS FOUR BASIC ELEMENTS

The Elements of AXP

Element 1: Training "Curriculum"

A definition of areas of architectural practice in which Aspiring Architects should acquire basic skills

Element 2: Advice

Information about experience, education and professional opportunities

The Elements of AXP

Element 3: Record-Keeping

A uniform national system for documenting experience activities

Element 4: Supplementary Experience Resources created to enrich training

The First Element of AXP, the "Training Standard" is divided into six broad "Experience Areas"

Experience Areas

- 1. Programming and Analysis (260 hours)
- 2. Project Planning and Design (1,080 hours)
- 3. Project Development and Documentation (1,520 hours)
- 4. Practice Management (160 hours)
- 5. Project Management (360 hours)
- 6. Construction and Evaluation (360 hours)

Total = 3,740 hours

The <u>Second</u> Element of AXP, the "Advisory System" consists of two Types of Advice

The "AXP Supervisor" and The "Mentor"


The "AXP Supervisor"



The "AXP Supervisor"

- The "AXP Supervisor" is the person who supervises your daily work
 - Assess the quality of your work
 - Certifies your NCARB Record
 - If you are working for an architectural firm, the "AXP Supervisor" must be licensed as an architect in any state
 - If you are working for an engineer, planner, interior designer, landscape architect, or contractor, your "AXP Supervisor" does not have to be a licensed Architect

The "Mentor"



The "Mentor"

- □ The "Mentor" must be a licensed Architect
 - He or she could be licensed in any state
 - Should work outside your firm to be unbiased
 - Meets with you on a monthly basis to discuss your career goals and achievements
 - If you are not employed, your Mentor could verify your
 Leadership and Service or Supplemental Experience training
 - Your Mentor is like a career coach

The <u>Third</u> Element of AXP is the Record-Keeping System, called the

"NCARB Record"

Recording your Experience

- Documentation of your experience is <u>YOUR</u> responsibility
- Continuous record-keeping is important
 - Assures accurate verification of experience
 - Guides your employer in making new assignments
 - Helps to plan Supplemental Experience for areas in which you may need more experience
 - Provides future employers with a good record of your experience

Recording your Experience

IDP EXPERIENCE SETTINGS



- A = <u>Architecture</u> work for U.S. or Canadian Architect (minimum 1,860 hours)
- O = Other work for a foreign architect, landscape architect or engineer (maximum of 1,860 hours)
- □ **S** = <u>Supplemental Experience</u> unemployed or work for a contractor, interior designer or planner (maximum of 1,860 hours)

The NCARB Record

- Contains hard evidence of your education and experience
- Is maintained by the National Council of Architectural Boards ("NCARB") in Washington, D.C.
- Is recognized by all Registration Boards throughout the United States and Canada, and is therefore "portable"
- Assists in deferring state and federal student loans
- Is submitted electronically to NCARB every six months

The Fourth Element of AXP is the Supplemental Experience System

Supplemental Experience

- Opportunities for experience in all Experience Areas will vary considerably depending on the firm you work for
- It is important for you to keep up to date with new information in the profession

REMEMBER

- √AXP is a <u>Training</u> Standard
- ✓Supplemental Experience cannot Substitute for all of the Minimum number of Hours in each Experience Area

AXP

- AXP has been in existence since 1978
- AXP is <u>required</u> for <u>ALL</u> candidates for licensure in Illinois
- AXP is <u>required</u> by all 50 states for licensing
- AXP is <u>required</u> by 23 states for "reciprocal" licensing
- AXP is required for NCARB "Certification" which will facilitate the process of becoming licensed in another state

- To be eligible to enroll in AXP:
- 1. Receive a high school diploma

(you can enroll in AXP immediately after graduation and begin earning Experience Hours)

- 2. Enroll in an architectural program
 - "Pre-Professional" architectural degree program
 - B.S. or B.A. in Architectural Studies (like offered at UIUC, UIC or SIUC)
 - This degree is not sufficient for licensure in Illinois but is in Wisconsin and a few other states
 - "Professional" architectural degree program
 - B. Arch. Degree (like offered at IIT)
 - M. Arch. degree (like offered at IIT, UIUC, UIC, SIUC, SAIC and Judson)

- Submit an application for an NCARB Record
 - Obtain application at <u>www.ncarb.org</u>
 - Navigate to "Start an NCARB Record online"
 - ■Fill out application and return it online with \$100.00 for one year of service
 - ■Annual renewal fee \$85.00

Online AXP application form

- Apply for admission to the Architectural Registration Examination (ARE) through NCARB
- Pay for the ARE (\$210.00 per division)
- Pass all 6 divisions of the ARE within a five year period
- You can take the exam after graduating from architectural school and while earning your AXP
 - If you do not pass a division, you may retake it within 60 days (but you will not be able to retake that division more than three times per year)

Complete the AXP

□ Complete the minimum number of AXP hours of experience its in each Experience Area for a total of 3,740 hours (about 2 years)

Recording your Experience

- You will fill out the AXP Online Reporting System form online every six months
 - Your experience cannot have been more than five years ago
 - Any experience older than eight months to five years will receive half credit
- When your completed report form is received, NCARB will notify your AXP Supervisor via e-mail
- AXP Supervisor will then log on to the AXP Online Reporting System and will access your record to verify your hours
- Once your AXP Supervisor has verified your hours, you will be given credit for them

Recording your Experience

- If you are unemployed or are still in school, you may submit your Supplemental Experience hours via the AXP Online Reporting System (you do not need an AXP Supervisor for this)
 - Your Mentor will verify your Supplemental Experience

WELCOME TO MY NCARB RECORD

Your NCARB Record is a detailed, verified record of your education and training. Maintained in Washington, DC, the record is used to compile qualifications for examination, registration, and certification.

My NCARB Record is a secure section of the NCARB web site where you may check your renewal date, renew your Record, request transmittals to registration boards, review your Record summary, review your IDP progress, and/or change your contact information.

NOTICE

On 1 January 2010, training units became training hours. One training unit equals eight training hours. The IDP training requirement went from 700 training units to 5,600 training hours. The actual number of hours required to complete the IDP remains the same.

One hour of acceptable work experience equals one training hour for all experience reports entered after 1 January 2010. The conversion of previously entered units to training hours happened automatically within the e-EVR. No experience was lost.



The IDP Online Reporting System Form

The Six-Month Rule



The Six-month Rule requires that you submit experience hours:

- in reporting periods of no longer than six months
- and within two months of completion of each reporting period
- However, you will be able to receive half credit for experience between eight months and five years ago






What is an experience setting? To earn hours for the IDP you must be employed (for pay) in an experience setting recognized by your registration board and NCARB. Check with the registration board in which you plan to become licensed to learn: their approved experience settings. What do saved, submitted, and approved

"Saved" experience reports are hours you. have entered for a specific reporting period. but have not yet submitted to your IDP. supervisor, mentor, or NCARB for approval. "Submitted" experience reports are hours you have submitted to your IDP supervisor. mentor, or NCARB for approval, but have not yet been approved. "Approved" experience reports are hours that have been verified by your IDP supervisor, mentor, or NCARB, and are now included in your IDP hour totals.

What is the difference between "return for edits" and "reject"?

When a supervisor returns a report for edits. an intern can edit the report and resubmit it to a supervisor for review and approval. When a supervisor rejects a report, the action is final and an intern can not receive credit for the hours in the report. - Now you will need to apply for and receive your license to practice architecture in Illinois

- Apply for NCARB Certification
 - NCARB Certification will allow you to be easily licensed to practice in any other state
 - Certification requires the following
 - Professional Degree in Architecture (B. Arch. or M. Arch.)
 - ARE passed
 - AXP Completed
 - Licensed in one State

- □ Join the AIA as a professional member
- Begin earning 18 "Learning Unit" Credits of continuing education per year to maintain your Illinois license and membership in the AIA

Interesting Statistics

Aspiring Architects in the USA

- □ There are 107,581 Licensed Architects
- There are 37,178 Aspiring Architects
- 3,543 completed the AXP last year
- 3,719 completed the ARE last year
- □ There are 24,989 students enrolled in architectural school

Aspiring Architects in Illinois
